EMERGENCY COMFORT KIT

It is strongly recommended that all students have a comfort kit. A comfort kit is a one-gallon plastic Ziploc bag which contains basic emergency essentials. These kits will be used to help each student be more comfortable in an emergency situation, which would require the student to stay at school for an extended period of time (ex. Lockdowns, chemical spills, etc.) These kits will be kept in your child's classroom. At the end of the school year, these kits will be sent home. The school will provide water, emergency carbohydrate bars, space blankets and first aid supplies.

Make sure ALL of your kit's items fit in a one-gallon Ziploc bag. Items should be securely packaged and easy to open without a can opener, with a shelf life of at least a school year. Make sure your child's kit is well labeled by placing a card inside with their name plainly visible. Each kit needs to have the following listed items or similar items:

Package of raisins

Dried fruit snacks

Package of nuts

Pudding cups

A plastic spoon

Fruit cups

Package of cheese/crackers

Younger children might like a family picture placed in their bag as well.
